Rules and Regulations for National-Level Competition 2025-26

1. Eligibility Criteria

- 1.1 Only registered students of SWI for the academic year 2025-26 are eligible to participate.
- 1.2 Students must meet all eligibility criteria as outlined in SWI's National Championship guidelines.
- 1.3 Eligible participants include those selected through school, and district, meeting the required scores.
- 1.4 The national participation option will be visible in the student's dashboard for eligible candidates.

2. Profile and Registration

- 2.1 Participants must update their profiles with:
 - Recent photograph.
 - Birth certificate.
 - Accurate postal address, email ID, and contact numbers.
 - T-shirt size.

2.2 Failure to complete the profile will result in disqualification, with no rescheduling or refunds.

3. Examination Format

- 3.1 The competition will use a USA-based proctoring system to ensure integrity.
- 3.2 Participants must enable their camera, microphone, and screen-sharing during the exam.
- 3.3 Student's ID card must be displayed on camera before starting the exam.
- 3.4 Students must wear an ID card with a long ribbon, which should be shown to the camera for identity confirmation before the exam starts.
- 3.5 Trial Oral Round exams can be attended from the student's respective school or home.

4. Technical and Infrastructure Requirements

- 4.1 Participants must have a stable internet connection and a functioning webcam, microphone, speaker and device (laptop/computer) capable of screen sharing.
- 4.2 Schools and students are responsible for arranging a distraction-free environment during the exam.

5. Exam Rules and Procedures

- 5.1 Participants are allowed one attempt per exam.
- 5.2 Submitting the exam without completing may not fetch marks for not attempted questions.

5.3 Rescheduling is not permitted. Absenteeism will be treated as a withdrawal, and no certificates or titles will be issued.

5.4 Tutorials will be available within student dashboard inside competition description and notice section to familiarize participants with the competition pattern.

5.5 The time limit for both the Trial Exam and the final National Championship is 45 minutes.

5.6 A negative marking system will be applied if a student exceeds the prescribed time limit. For every additional two minutes taken, one mark will be deducted from the total score.

6. Competition Rounds

6.1 The competition includes multiple rounds specific to student groups and grades: as outlined in the prospectus.

6.2 Types of rounds as per the group/category will be as mentioned in the prospectus.

7. Wild Card Entries

7.1 Schools can nominate wild card entries for students who missed previous competitions due to genuine reasons.

7.2 Wild card entrie fee is Rs.2500+ tax, inclusive of preparatory material and competition fee.

8. Scoring and Prizes

8.1 A minimum score of 40% is required to qualify for prizes or titles. While passing percentage will be 35%.

8.2 The top 10 performers in each group will receive certificates, with the top positions awarded trophies and cash prizes.

8.3 Cash Prize details will be as mentioned in the prospectus.

8.4 In case of a tie between multiple students, we'll conduct an additional tiebreaker round between those with the same score.

8.5 Title Eligibility and Award Method will be taken into the consideration for all the titles.

9. Code of Conduct

9.1 Participants must adhere to SWI's rules and instructions during the competition.

9.2 Any form of malpractice or rule violation will lead to immediate disqualification.

10. Promotional Activities

10.1 Participants must attend promotional activities as required, including media interviews and award ceremonies.

11. Disputes and Final Decisions

11.1 The Competition Committee's decisions are final and binding.

11.2 SWI reserves the right to modify rules without prior notice. Participants must check the SWI platform for updates regularly.

12. Payment and Cancellation Policy

12.1 Online Submissions: All entries must be submitted through the dedicated online portal at www.competition.spellwellindia.com, accessible via the student login. Each eligible student has been assigned a specific Username and Password for logging in to the Online Entry System. Individual entries sent via mail or any other form of communication will not be accepted.

12.2 It is imperative that all entries receive approval before the deadline. However, schools are allowed to submit entries via email or another prescribed mode of communication.

12.3 Cancellation of participation is not allowed under any circumstances.

12.4 Transfer of participants from one State to another is allowed only before the start of the season. Once registered with a particular State, the participants will not be given any transfer during the academic year.

13. Online Award Ceremony and Additional Oral Round

13.1 Spell Well India may organize an online result declaration ceremony to honor national top-performing students. This event will be exclusive to all NLC participants.

13.2 In case of online result declaration ceremony students can check virtual meeting link from their respective dashboard notice section or visit www.spellwellindia.com/schedule

13.2 Prizes such as cash awards, trophies, and certificates for national winners will be distributed from their respective schools.

14. Results Announcement for SWI's National Championship:

14.1 The results for the SWI National Championship will be declared on 29th March 2026.

15. Title Eligibility and Award Method

All titles are decided separately for each Group/Category. Total marks are out of 100.

15.1 Eligibility (Minimum Marks Required)

A student becomes eligible for a title only if they meet the minimum marks shown below:

- Champion eligibility: 85 marks or above
- Winner eligibility: 74 marks or above
- 1st Runners-Up eligibility: 64 marks or above
- 2nd Runners-Up eligibility: 54 marks or above
-

Among Top 10 eligibility: More than 45 marks (i.e., 46 and above)

15.2 How Titles Are Actually Awarded

Titles are awarded based on highest scores, but only among students who meet the eligibility cut-offs.

- Champion is awarded to the highest scorer only if the highest score is 85 or above.
- Winner is awarded to the next highest scorer, provided they meet Winner eligibility (74+).
- 1st Runners-Up goes to the next highest scorer, provided they meet 64+.
- 2nd Runners-Up goes to the next highest scorer, provided they meet 54+.
- Among Top 10 is awarded to students who are in the Top 10 ranks of that group/category and have scored 46 or above.

If a required minimum is not met, that title is not awarded for that Group/Category.

Example 1 (All top scorers qualify for Champion)

In Group 3 (English), the top marks are:

- Aarav: 90
- Diya: 89
- Kabir: 88
- Meera: 85

Awards:

- Champion: Aarav (90)
- Winner: Diya (89)
- 1st Runners-Up: Kabir (88)
- 2nd Runners-Up: Meera (85)

(Reason: The highest score is 90 which is 85+, so Champion is awarded, and the next ranks receive the next titles if eligible.)

Example 2 (Champion not awarded because highest score is below 85)

In Group 2 (Sanskrit), the highest marks are:

- Riya: 80
- Om: 78
- Neel: 70
- Isha: 55

Awards:

- Champion: Not awarded (highest score is 80, which is below 85)
- Winner: Riya (80) (eligible for Winner because 74+)
- 1st Runners-Up: Om (78) (eligible because 64+)
- 2nd Runners-Up: Isha (55) (eligible because 54+)

(Neel scored 70, so he is not eligible for Winner, but may be considered for titles where he meets eligibility, as applicable.)

Note

If multiple students score the same marks, standard tie-handling rules of the competition will apply (as stated in the prospectus / results policy).
